# GRCC student hospitalized after freak balancing accident in LSC

GRCC Sophomore Kris Dewsin suffered severe injuries while trying to balance a chair on his chin last Thursday. Dewsin temporarily lost his balance and the chair came tumbling down on top of him, breaking his jaw bone, fracturing his collar bone, and leaving a major hematoma surrounding his left eye.

Dewsin, knocked unconscious from the fall, was immediately rushed to Auburn General Hospital where he was treated for his injuries. Dewsin had to undergo two surgeries to reset his jaw.

Doctors say he should be back to full ability in no time as long as his break heals properly. For now he'll have to settle for balancing well needed rest and visiting friends.

He was able to answer some questions by writing them down. "I was doing fine, balancing the chair was nothing new to me, and I've balanced far bigger things than that before," said Dewsin. "I don't know what happened, one minute everything was going great,

Show of Talent, balancing everything from a broom to a ladder.


Dewsin's injuries won't stop him from achieving his goal of being the world's greatest chin balancer, he said. "I'm not going to let this minor incidence stop

singing again she replied, "Definitely, I just want to get my life back in order first, I'd possibly like to get into acting also, but nothing's definite so far."

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
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# Murder of GRCC student reporter leaves one man dead and a campus in shock

Current Editor Matt Phelps is currently under arrest for the alleged shooting and death of Current Reporter Akio Segawa. Police are currently searching the Current office for current evidence, and if this paragraph mentions the word "current" one more time the assumed reader may hunt the alleged writer down, which is cause for a whole new article.

Police report that Phelps readily admitted to shooting Segawa and turned himself in immediately. The death occurred as the result of a late story turned in by Segawa. Phelps is currently being held but will most likely be let go. Phelps is also

Indeed people everywhere are shocked about this situation. The family of Segawa has released a report saying that Segawa will be

A memorial is set for this weekend at Cledith's Funeral home and BBQ. It will feature the relaxing sounds of Yanni remixed to the upbeat sounds of country folk.





Maybe if smokers had been more considerate, this would never have happened. But for now, everyone will have to learn to live with it," stated Down.




came as the biggest shock. Besides the fact that he turned down major league money, it's a well known fact that he has never caught a fish in his life.

Investigators J. Waltz and D. Shore showed up on campus Tuesday to snoop around for clues. But they left on Thursday without success.


"we found nothing out of the ordinary, let alone anything off the planet," said Shore. "It was probably students playing a joke. Nothing is going on at GRCC."
